#### **New Living Translation**

The man wanted to justify his actions, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus replied with a story: "A Jewish man was traveling from Jerusalem down to Jericho, and he was attacked by bandits. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him up, and left him half dead beside the road. By chance a priest came along. But when he saw the man lying there, he



crossed to the other side of the road and passed him by. A Temple assistant walked over and looked at him lying there, but he also passed by on the other side. Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. Going over to him, the Samaritan soothed his wounds with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. The next day he handed the innkeeper two silver coins, telling him, 'Take care of this man. If his bill runs higher than this, I'll pay you the next time I'm here.'

Now which of these three would you say was a neighbor to the man who was attacked by bandits?" Jesus asked. The man replied, "The one who showed him mercy." Then Jesus said, "Yes, now go and do the same."

Amen.






## Parable: THE Good Samaritan



Jesus told this story to show that people of any culture should be treated with kindness.




A man was walking along the road from Jerusalem to the town of Jericho when some bad men ran off with his coat and left him lying on the side of the road, badly hurt.




The hurt man lay in the hot sun.



## Salt Dough Kind Hands part 1



Before you start heat oven to 150 °C

#### To make the hands you will need:

Flour (ideally plain but use what you have), table salt, water, cup (any size), mixing bowl, spoon, knife, baking paper, oven tray, 2 cereal bowls, rolling pin, A4 paper, pen, scissors.





1. Put 4 cups of flour in mixing bowl.



2. Add 1 cup of salt to mixing bowl.



3. Add 1 1/2 cups of warm water to mixing bowl.



4. stir the flour, salt & water together with a spoon



5. Keep stirring until the dough starts to come together as a ball.



6. Take the ball of dough out of the bowl and place on a floured table. Knead the dough with your hands until it is smooth.



7. Cut 2 large pieces of baking paper.



8. Place 1 piece of baking paper on the table & put dough ball in the middle of the paper.



9. Cover dough ball with second piece of baking paper.



10. Press down on dough. Use the rolling pin to roll out the dough so that it is about 5mm/ 1/2cm - 10mm/1cm thick.





11. Fold A4 in half & then draw around hand. Cut out.



12. Gently press hands onto salt dough.



13. Carefully cut around hands with knife. Keep left over salt dough to make some more things or use as playdough.



14. Gently peal off hand templates & cut the baking paper around the hands.



15. Place 2 bowls upside down on oven tray.



16. Carefully place the salt dough hands on top of the bowls with the baking paper still Attached. Press down on the hands so they follow the shape of the bowl.

#### Now you need an ADULT to cook the Salt Dough Kind Hands.

ADULTS... Put the oven tray onto the middle shelf in the oven and cook the salt dough until the hands are hard to touch and sound hollow when you tap them. The time it takes will depend on the oven you use so check the hands after the first hour and then every half hour until you are happy. When cooked take the hands out of the oven and leave to cool.

























## Salt Dough Kind Hands part 2



To decorate
Salt Dough hands
you will need:

Salt dough hands, paint, paint brushes, pencil, PVA glue, glitter.





1. Draw a heart in the middle of the salt dough hand.



2. Paint hand in any colour you want. If you do not want to have a heart on hand, paint the hand in all the same colour. When the hand is dry, give it a second coat of paint.



3. When dry, turn over & paint the other side of hands.



**4**. When hand is dry carefully paint the heart with PVA glue.



**5**. Cover the PVA glue heart with glitter & then shake off any loose glitter.



6. Cover the hands with PVA glue & leave to dry. Turn hands over & paint again with PVA glue.







**Sharing kindness**

## Little sausage people!

#### You will need:

- 1. Canned or jarred hot dog sausages (Frankfurters)
- 2. Shortcrust pastry ready-made pastry
- 3. A little flour
- 4. A knife
- 5. Rolling pin
- 6. Chopping board
- 7. Oven tin

#### Method:

- Put the oven on at 180 ° C
- \*\*\* An adult will need to help you with using the cooker \*\*\*
- Sprinkle a small amount of flour on the chopping board and rolling pin.
- Take a small amount of dough and roll it into a thin strip on the chopping board.
- Cut a split in the sausage for the legs and two splits for the
- Use strips of dough and wrap it as 'bandages' around the little sausage person.
- Place the small person on a baking tray.
- Ask the help of an adult to put the tin in the oven.
- After about 15 20 minutes, ask an adult to help you remove the small sausage people from the oven.
- Enjoy with a bit of ketchup!

Jesus asked, "which one of them was a neighbour would you say?" "The one who helped" the man replied." "Then go and do the same!"


My neighbour is ev'ryone, ev'rywhere; whatever country that might be. Especially those who I see all the time; even the ones who don't like me!

#### **Plaster**

## **Bandages**

#### You will need:

- Roll of toilet paper
- Timer phone or watch

In the story Jesus told, the Samaritan bandaged the wounds of the man who had been hurt.

#### How to play:

- Take one minute to bandage another player's arm or leg with the toilet roll.
- Each player takes it in turns to play.
- Decide together who has made the neatest bandage.



### 3 legged race

#### You will need:

- a scarf to tie to each pair of people,
- 2, 4 or 6 players

#### How to play:

- Two players stand next to each other as a pair.
- They tie the scarf around the two legs closest to each other.
- Choose a safe place for your race with a start line and a finish line.
- If you have enough people you can race against each other. Otherwise you could time yourselves and try again.




## A verse learning game

#### You will need:

- Toilet paper
- Felt pen
- The verse: Jesus said, "You go and do the same."

#### How to play:

- Write the verse on toilet paper one word on each piece of paper.
- Read the whole verse twice.
- Cut one word out of the paper and screw it into a ball.
- Say the verse again and remember to say the word that has gone.
- Continue this way until you say the verse without paper at all.

### **Charades**

#### What you will need:

- Kind acts / ways you can be kind written on small pieces of paper e.g. making someone a cup of tea
- A bag or tub to hold the pieces of paper

#### How to play:

- Put the folded pieces of paper with all the ideas for things written on them in the tub.
- Players need to take it in turns to select a piece of paper from the tub, then they must mime the action indicated on the paper.
- Other players must guess what the action is.
